6.3Quality improvement strategies adoptedby the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The college follows the curriculum given by Calcutta University as it is an affiliated college. An academic calendar is given by this University which has details about the exams and practical. The teachers plan their curriculum delivery based on this plan. The syllabus is divided to the faculties by the HOD. Any issues related to curriculum will be addressed by the HOD, IQAC or the Principal.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Various innovative ideas are being adopted by the faculties to effectively deliver curriculum and a better teaching-learning process. The faculty members are encouraged to use ICT in their teaching methods like making use of PPT's, videos, documentaries, charts, graphs wherever necessary. This is found to be more effective than the chalk and talk method of teaching.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

The final examination is conducted and evaluated by the affiliating University. However, for the internal tests, mid-term review and other tests the answer scripts are distributed in the classrooms by the respective faculties. The students can see the answer scripts and understand the areas where they have gone wrong. Any issues related to evaluation is addressed by the concerned faculties or even by the HOD.
